TODAY'S PROGRAM: Mr. Berkey Knavel, a chaplain for the Hospice program,  
was introduced by Tom Lowry and brought an informative program on the purpose and  
services of Hospice. Hospice is a program of palliative care for terminally ill  
patients who have been referred by a physician. Hospice volunteers concentrate  
on comfort and treatment of pain in order to enhance the quality of life while life  
remains. The program also recognizes that the whole family is disrupted in a funda-  
mental way by having a member terminally ill. Counseling services are, therefore,  
extended to the whole family.

The services of Hospice are free to patients. Funding is provided through  
gifts and grants. Club members were reminded, however, that even with heavy  
dependence on volunteerism, additional support is needed. Anyone wishing to

Hospice.
