W. Page FAULK, MD, FRC Path, Sci.D Status of the H1N1 Vaccine

Dr. Faulk's resume is so extensive and impressive it is hard to summarize his accomplishments. He received his B.S. degree from the University of the South, Sewanee, TN, and his MD from Tulane University in New Orleans, LA. He specialized in pediatrics and immunology. He has travelled the world performing research, teaching, speaking, publishing articles and studying immunology. Today he talked about the status of the H1N1 Virus.

The first isolated case of the H1N1 appeared in April 2009 in Southern California. Within three months, every state in the U.S. had reported cases. In June 2009 it was declared a pandemic level 6. In October 2009 the President declared a national emergency due to the rapid transfer of the virus from person to person. In 1918 the first epidemic (Spanish Flu) killed four times the number of people killed in the war at that time.

Is the current strain of the H1N1 virus as dangerous as the Spanish Flu? Research shows it is not. In 1997 an Alaskan Eskimo who died from the Spanish Flu was excavated and a specimen extracted from her lung. The virus was injected into mice and that was their demise. The 2009 H1N1 virus was injected into mice and none of them died.

Why do people die? Individuals at high risk are persons with chronic disease and the underlying disease slips out of control. Sometimes there is a superimposed bacterial infection which needs to be treated with an antibiotic, as well as, an antiviral medicine.

An individual infected with the H1N1 is contagious for 24 hours prior to symptoms and 7-10 days afterwards. Treatment consists of common sense, anti-viral drugs and vaccines. As stated above, anyone with a chronic disease should be vaccinated regardless of age.
