President Brooke presented **Dr. Phillip Carlyle** with his Blue Badge.

Hamsa Thota recognized the **Group Study Exchange** delegation from India: Mr. Nandoo Nandakumar is an architect and the team leader of the group, Dr. Karthik Sherry is a dentist, Mr. Keshava is a college professor, Dr. Srikoushthubba is a pathologist, and Mrs.Ramyashree is a music school administrator.

Speaker George Constanitino is the manager of the **Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge**. The Native Americans called it Okefenokee, meaning, "Land of the Trembling Earth." The refuge was started in 1936 by the congress to protect wildlife, and is 401,900 acres in size. It is the 16<sup>th</sup> most visited national wildlife refuge.

The three goals of the refuge are (1) to sustain a healthy forest industry and a healthy environment, (2) to develop a fire resistant conservation zone around the swamp and (3) to restore the native longleaf pine and 40,000 acres of uplands, to presettlement conditions.

Every 3 – 5 years there will be a fire of 100,000 acres or more. The fire of 2007 had a huge economic impact on our region. It destroyed 65 million dollars worth of timber.

Each year there are between 200,000 and 400,000 visitors to the Okefenokee Swamp Refuge. The goal is to have 800,000 visitors a year. The average stay is 4-6 hours. About half of the visitors are from Georgia, one fourth are from Florida and 2-5% are international visitors. Brochures and leaflets are printed in several different languages.

There are many visitor opportunities at Okefenokee. There are boat tours and more than 120 miles of wilderness trails for kayaks and canoes. There are fishing events for youths, hunting programs, environmental classroom programs with interactive displays and wildlife photography programs with tours. A restored swamper's homestead is on site to visit. Concession meals are available as well as picnic areas and a RV campsite. There is also a traveling exhibit to loan out.

Resource Economists estimate that the Okefenokee Refuge in 2004 stimulated about \$65,000,000 in revenue and 650 jobs and provided \$30 million in visitor recreation expenditures with \$400,000 in direct payment in taxes to counties.
