



Bob Brearley & Monica Jolley

Bob Brearley—Bob began his talk by quoting the Psalm: 16, "...Pleasant places were measured out for me; fair to me indeed is my inheritance.. " And, many pleasant places and a very unique inheritance Bob has experienced during his impressive career as a Presbyterian minister.

Bob is known to many islanders as pastor of the St. Simons Presbyterian Church – a position he has held for 14 years. Bob spoke about his family and upbringing, and the series of churches that circuitously brought him to St. Simons Island. A fifth-generation Presbyterian minister, Bob filled us in on his family's proud heritage beginning with his great-great-grandfather, who started the family tradition in the early 1800s. Bob's own career took him to humble congregations deep in the swamp lands of South Carolina, then on to churches in South Carolina, Virginia, Savannah, and finally to St. Simons in 1998.
