St Simons Island Rotary Scholarship Fund

The SSI Rotary Scholarship Fund - What do we do?

- Award scholarships each year to graduating seniors from Glynn County, including students from Glynn Academy, Brunswick High, Frederica Academy, and students who are Home schooled.
- o Four year scholarships are for \$1500 for 8 semesters or a total of \$12,000.

History:

- Scholarship program founded in 1952-1953 with an initial balance of \$600.
- 1961 The St Simons Rotary Foundation, Inc. was formally set up as a legal entity.
- 1975 The Foundation (along with various other groups) built the Rotary Scout Hut on Demere Rd on County land, which was donated to the County in the late 80's for multi-purpose use.
- From the inception of the Fund to the mid 80's, Ed Bruce was the Secretary/Treasurer of the Scholarship Fund.
- 1993 Ed Bruce Fellow was established --> Become a Fellow with a \$1,000.00 contribution, or be a Sustaining Member with a \$100.00 annual contribution.
- 1996 Gil Tharpe leaves a contribution in his will of \$430,000 to the Scholarship Fund
- 2023 Steve and Randy Hires leave a substantial contribution in their will to the Scholarship Fund totaling \$760,000 (\$450m 3/23/23, \$310m 11/30/23).

Scholarship Funds:

- Currently have total investment of ~\$1.8m which saw declines in 2022, and a strong recovery in 2023, bolstered by donations from the Hires Estate of \$760k. Balance in 2000 was \$604k. Stats from 2000 through Spring 2024 show that we have paid ~\$750k in Scholarship Funds directly to students during that period of time. Data from 1953 to 1999 not available, but if included, would likely make the total approach \$1m since the program began.
- Investments are balanced to minimize risk and produce constant cash flows for ongoing scholarships. Investments are managed by 2 individuals, in conjunction with a financial advisor.

• The Scholarship process:

- Applications go live on February 1st
- Completed applications are due on March 1st
- Application Committee reviews the applicants and ranks them based on 10 criteria ranging from standardized test scores and GPA to community and school involvement
- Interviews are given to the top 10-12 candidates in April
- Scholarships are decided at the end of interviews and the recipients are notified
- Presentation of Scholarship Recipients and contract signing is in May at a Rotary Meeting.
- To continue receiving Scholarship payments, a student has to maintain a full course load and a 2.5 GPA. A copy of transcripts sent directly from the Univ/College is required.
