## Presidential Celebration Comes to Macon

RI President Jonathan B. Majiyagbe has slated 15 one-day Presidential Celebrations for the 2003-04 Rotary year to spotlight outstanding Rotary projects and initiatives in various parts of the world. Each mini-conference will have a specific focus. The Celebration planned for Macon on March 18 will bring the Rotary spotlight to literacy, a challenge of surprising proportion, even here in the United States. The Macon Celebration will be held at the Macon Centreplex.

According to Majiyagbe, "Literacy is the cornerstone of human well-being. It is vital that everyone have the opportunity to learn to read. My goal is that this event will serve as a catalyst for future action by the participants and their clubs and districts in the area of literacy. I want this to be the start of something dynamic and exciting for everyone in this part of the Rotary world".

Celebration participants will hear expert presentations on literacy and have the opportunity to hear Rotary literacy success stories, and to share their experiences and insights.

To attend the program, participants must submit a \$30 registration fee. Cost to attend the program and gala is \$60,

while the cost of attending President Majiyagbe's breakfast on March 19 at 8 a.m. is \$30.

# DISTRICT NEWS

## ***Skidaway Island***

The Skidaway Island Rotary Club conducted a reverse raffle/silent auction on Feb. 20 in the Plantation Club at The Landings. The event featured a \$2,000 grand prize and many opportunities to win additional prizes through the raffle, game boards and bingo.

Money generated from the event benefitted local organizations, including Communities in Schools, Royce Learning Center, Safe Shelter, Bethesda Boys Home, Savannah Health Mission and the Community Health Care Club. Some funds will be used to support the Club's RYLA, Rotoract, GRSP and other international efforts.

## ***Dublin Rotary Club***

The West Laurens High School Interact Club worked with the Dublin Rotary Club during their Coats for Caring Day. More than 400 coats were collected by the Interact Club, which enabled the Dublin Rotary Club to contribute more than 600 coats, including more than 200 coats collected by the Dublin Rotary Club, to the area's needy through the Salvation Army.

Clift Crews, chairman of the Partners in Service committee, coordinated the project. Kudos to both the West Lauren High School Interact Club and the Dublin Rotary Club for their work on this community project.

The Dublin Rotary Club has provided 1,000 Bible packages through the club's international service project to troops abroad. Russell Burch, chairman of the club's international committee, is coordinating the project. Russell found out that there was a need for 18,000 Bibles a month for our troop overseas. He arranged through Campus Crusade to buy 1,000 "Do You Know Jesus?" packets which included a camouflage New Testament along with other literature.

## ***Group Study Exchange***

This report is from District 6920 GSE Team Leader Bill Blankenship:

In December, the district's Group Study Exchange Team Selection Committee met and interviewed applicants. The Selection Committee members included DG Leon Benefield, Gordon Mathews, John Neely, Bill Blankenship, PDG Carolyn Ishee, PDG Jeanette Caneega and DGE John Parkins.

The team selected is composed of two ladies and two gentlemen. Sean Brandon is a public administrator for the City of Savannah. Karin Best is a health and physical education teacher from Savannah. Joan Dare is in the design architecture business in Savannah. Jason Mehler is a pediatric physical therapist from Milledgeville. The team leader is Bill Blankenship from the Rotary Club of Camden County.

The GSE team is scheduled to depart for Santiago, Chile, on March 23 and visit in Rotary District 4340 until their return on April 26.

The Group Study Exchange Program is a unique cultural and vocational exchange opportunity for young business and professional men and women between the ages of 24 and 40 in the initial years of their professional life. The program provides travel grants for teams of young participants to exchange visits between paired areas in different countries. For four to six weeks, team members study the host country's institutions and ways of life, observe their own vocations as practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships and exchange ideas.


