When announcing the year's theme, President Rattakul noted that, "There are thousands of activities going on at this moment in the name of Rotary. Whatever we do, one element remains

stop to question the time or money we are sacrificing. We are inspired to do more, to give more. Love is the motivating force behind all of Rotary's best work.

"We Rotarians already have so much love within ourselves, but with the ambitious goals that we have set before us, we need more people to share our beliefs and commitments. The best way we can ensure the continuity of our organization is by Sowing the Seeds of Love in as many hearts as possible.

A Member of Parliament for nine terms since 1969 and Leader of the Democrat Party, he has served his country as Foreign Minister, Deputy Prime Minister, Speaker of the House of Representatives and President of the

A Message from the District Governor

Dear Fellow Rotarians and Friends,

This is the beginning of an exciting year for me and I hope, for you. Frosty and I are looking forward to getting around to each club and getting to know as many of you as possible. You probably should be warned now that I am terrible about remembering names. Please don't be offended if I don't recall your name, even though we may have just met. It's a shortcoming I need to work on, nevertheless, it exists and will probably not get corrected by the time we get to your club.

Aside from the continuing emphasis on membership, one of the most important and exciting issues we will be focusing on this year is the beginning of the end for the polio virus. Rotary International estimates that some 60 percent or more of you were not in Rotary in 1985 when the Rotary Foundation decided to take on the unimaginable job of wiping out polio worldwide. The initial goal of the campaign for funds in 1985 was to raise \$120 million. Over the next two years, you and your fellow Rotarians raised more than \$247 million. To date, Rotarians have contributed more than \$373 million to the effort. The goal is to be able to declare the world polio free by Rotary's 100th anniversary in 2005.

In the first year of the PolioPlus campaign, there were approximately 350,000 new cases of the wild polio virus reported worldwide. For 2001, less than 600 were reported. For 2002, less than 50 have been reported. The new cases are primarily in northern India, Pakistan, Afghanistan and a few in Africa.

We must get to these last areas and wipe out the virus to prevent the resurgence of the disease. A total of \$400 million is needed to finish the job. Rotary has been challenged to raise \$80 million; to be pledged this year and paid over three years. If we do, various foundations will leverage our gift to the \$400 million needed. Please consider helping.

Again, Frosty and I look forward to meeting each of you and we hope that you and your club have a prosperous and successful Rotary year.
