Rudolf Horndler has retired as senior partner for Notare Horndler/Dr. Ulbrich, a notary partnership. Mr. Horndler was born in Schwabach, Germany. Following secondary school, he attended Beloit College in the United States as a Fulbright Scholar, and also attended both the University of Munich and the Free University of Berlin, in Germany. He graduated from law school at the University of Erlangen, Germany.

Rolf was a director of Neumarkter Konzertfreunde, a nonprofit organization that arranges concerts of internationally recognized artists, particularly in chamber music. He previously was co-

founder of a local non-partisan voters group from which he was elected to his county assembly. He also served as a director of his local Schul-Elternbeirat, a

parent-run school board.

A Rotarian since 1974, he is a member and past president of the Rotary Club of Nurnberg-Furth. He has served Rotary International as director, district governor, Group Study Exchange team leader, International Assembly discussion group leader, regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, committee member and sergeant at arms for the 1987 Rotary International Convention in Munich, Germany.
