Hilburn who were tragically killed in an airplane crash last May 4, the opening day of the 2007 District Conference in Savannah.

"We have intentionally delayed the announcement of this fund in consideration of Jeff and Jim's families," said Frank W. Seaton, Jr., president-elect of The Dublin Rotary Club. "However, at this time Jim's son-in-law and Jeff's son, both Dublin Rotarians, have authorized us the make a general announcement of this fund to those closest to them and the Rotary District is included in that group."

The club hopes to award the first scholarship in May, around the anniversary of the deaths of Jim and Jeff. The fund is part of a 501© 3 organization and contributions are tax deductible.
