has been great and was reinforced in 2004 when he was named recipient of the James J. Corbett Memorial Award, presented annually by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) to the collegiate administrator who "through the years has most typified Corbett's devotion to intercollegiate athletics and worked unceasingly for its betterment." The award is the highest honor one can achieve in collegiate athletics administration.

Awards Submissions Due by April 1

All clubs are encouraged to submit for awards. You must fill out the form in the directory for points to be considered for club of the year.

This year we are giving banners for three categories: small, medium and large. You may display the banner at your club and keep it for one year.

There are many clubs who have performed well and the district wants to give proper recognition. All entries must be sent to Awards Chair Bertha Daniel, ABAC, 2802 Moore Highway, Tifton, GA 31792-2601.

District Looking for Next 'Rookie of the Year'

This is a program started in 2002 whereby District 6920 recognizes one new Rotarian from the district for outstanding contributions to his or her club and/or district.

Any Rotarian admitted to a club during the <u>calendar</u> year preceding a district conference is eligible to be nominated by his or her club. If a new member is inducted after July 1, he or she can, if they wish, defer their eligibility until the following year. The selection will be made by the College of Governors at the district conference in Augusta in May. The winner will be recognized on Saturday night at the Governor's banquet.

The selection will be based roughly on the Red Badge program also started in 2002. The nominee to accumulate the most points will be named the Rookie of the Year. Points will be awarded as follows:

- 15 Points Make up at another club
- 20 Points Maintain 100% attendance
- 25 Points Attend a District or International level function, Joint Seminar, District Conference, District Assembly, International Convention, etc.
- 15 Points Give a classification talk to your club
- 20 Points Get actively involved in a club committee
- 10 Points Participate in a club meeting by leading the prayer or singing, introducing guests, assessing fines, being a greeter, etc.
- 25 Points Bring a new member into the club
- 10 Points Attend a club board meeting
- 25 Points Take the Evanston leadership trip, usually in May
- 15 Points Find and present a club program
- 15 Points Host a GRSP student for a meal or weekend
- 25 Points Host a GSE team member in your home when they are in your area
- 15 Points Read the ABC's of Rotary by Past RI President Cliff Dochterman
- 10 Points Display the Rotary Wheel on your car or office
- 20 Points Participate in a Club Service Project
- Up to 25 Points Subjective based on the write-up accompanying the nomination

Presidential Citations & Governors Award of Excellence

The Presidential Citation and Governors Award are due April 1. All clubs are encouraged to submit for these two awards.

The forms need to be sent to DG Dallas Simon, 2225 Wheeless Road, Augusta, GA 30904. The Presidential Citation forms must be in by this date. They have to be sent to Rotary International after the data is verified. The Governors Award of Excellence submissions must also be received by April 1.

All clubs have worked very hard and I encourage each club to submit for these awards.

PR Tips of the Month

NEWS RELEASES

News releases are basic media outreach tools. A release should provoke interest, be connected to something concrete and include a local angle. Begin with a short, attentiongrabbing headline. Just as important is a well thought-out "news hook." The news hook, should be in the first paragraph provides direction to the rest of the release.

The remaining paragraphs should answer the following basic questions, same as promoting events:

Who

What

Where

When Whv

Limit releases to one page and include a photo that shows action or tells the story.
