# Georgia Rotary Student Program Prepares to Welcome Class of 2008-2009

As August nears, the Georgia Rotary Student Program (GRSP) is busy preparing to welcome the 68 students who will comprise the class of 2008-2009.

The students (47 females and 21 males), are from 24 countries and will attend 26 colleges and universities throughout the State of Georgia.

GRSP, now in its Sixty-Third year, is a one (academic) year non-degree seeking scholarship program, which brings to Georgia exceptional students from around the world as a means of promoting world peace through better understanding.

Since its founding in 1946 by PDG Will Watt of Thomasville, GRSP has hosted 3060 students from 105 countries. GRSP actively recruits qualified applicants from every corner of the world. In 2007-2008, GRSP hosted its first student from Uzbekistan.

GRSP is the only program jointly administered by Districts 6900, 6910 and 6920.

#### **District 6920 CART Goals**

At the Peach State President's Training earlier this year for club president-elects, the announcement for District 6920's 2008-2009 goals for club participation with CART (Coins for Alzheimer's Research Trust) was announced.

An overall goal for 100% participation from our 65 Rotary clubs was introduced to the PE attendees. CART has been a very active support program seeking research opportunities from the leading research institutions in the United States. Eleven Rotary Districts throughout North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia have actively supported this great program that provides financial grants to leading research institutions that apply for grant support. District 6920 is the second leading District of all eleven Rotary districts for the 2007-2008 year with Rotarians contributing pocket-change totaling over \$40,000. The opportunity for Rotarians to help find solutions to this disease come from weekly contributions to the blue CART buckets in which pocket-change is collected.

Kathy Tuckey, a member of the Rotary Club of Augusta West, will serve as D-6920's CART Chair for the 2008-2009 year. Kathy will be sharing the great efforts that CART is contributing to Alzheimer's research. Kathy will also offer educational information for Rotary clubs to enable our District to provide greater support to CART's future research assistance. #### **Matching Grant Updates**

The Matching Grant application has been revised for the Rotary year 2008-2009 and is now available on-line. The revisions took into account recent Trustee decisions requiring the signature of the district governor to authorize District Designated Funds and the revised Competitive Matching Grant submission deadline of December 15. Clubs and districts are encouraged to submit Matching Applications to Grants Chair, PDG Lynn Hadwin. The Guide to Matching Grants also has been updated and is available for download on the RI website.

The number of Matching Grant applications submitted to TRF during 2007-08 increased 25% for the 2006-07 Rotary year.

SAVANNAH, GA (WTOC) - School will be out soon in Savannah and Chatham County and this summer students will have a new cool place to check out books.

#### Rotary District 6920 Medical Equipment Transport Service, Inc. METS

Midway through our fourth year of existence, the mission of METS to reduce the pain and suffering of the world's poor by redistributing retired medical equipment and supplies is more critical than ever before. And District 6920 is responding like never before. As district Rotarians spread the word, our donor base is increasing and the quality of medical donations is improving.

Recently, Savannah Cardiology donated a complete Electron Beam Tomography Scanner, the disassembly and crating of which was financed through the St. Joseph's Mission Foundation; Effingham County Hospital contributed a full room x-ray system; our METS truck picked up the contents of the complete 3-room office of Dr. Mike Kulungowski, a retiring general surgeon in Sumter, SC, premium quality equipment, manuals and supplies including his surgical units. All of these gifts were the result of Rotary connections. Savannah area hospitals, Memorial Medical Center and St. Joseph's/Candler, continue to be our mainstay for sterile supplies and for much retired equipment. Some of our other recent donors include Jeff Davis Hospital, the Brunswick Rotary Club, Dr. Tom Graham – Savannah and A Plus Mobility – Augusta, GA.

We have already received enough applications for containers to take us into mid-2009, so we must continue to broaden our donor base if we are to accommodate the medical requests of our recipient organizations. To assist with our efforts the 10-club Augusta Area Council voted in May to make METS one of their feature projects for the next year. They have located storage space and we are beginning work to set up a satellite collection project in Augusta and the surrounding areas.

Sort Days: All supplies received at METS must be packed and documented before shipping. We accomplish this on Saturday mornings when club members come to the METS warehouse to work for four hours. No medical knowledge is required. We need a minimum of 10 and a maximum of 17 workers. We are scheduling Fall Sort Days now. "Imagine the Possibilities" if every child in our community enters Kindergarten having been read to regularly by the most important teacher they will ever have - their parents.

#### A New Book Every Month!

In participating Georgia counties, each month, until age 5, a new book will be mailed directly to the registered child's home address. We are currently in Baldwin, Butts, Calhoun, Carroll, Catoosa, Charlton, Chatham, Chattooga, Clarke, Colquitt, Coweta, Dade, Dawson, Dougherty, Effingham, Elbert, Fannin, Forsyth, Franklin, Gilmer, Glynn, Grady, Greene, Habersham, Hancock, Haralson, Hart, Harris, Heard, Henry, Jasper, Lamar. **Warren and White** counties and we have 4 urban pilot programs functioning: Children may receive up to a maximum of 60 books, depending on their age when they enter the program.

### The Imagination Library There is absolutely no cost (ever) to registered children

Each child will receive one book monthly that is to be read to them by their parents or care givers, and then placed in the specially designed bookends that will also be available. These books become the child's own to read over and over and perhaps pass down to their children.

District 6920 has several counties advancing to bring the Ferst Foundation to eligible children in their communities. All clubs are encouraged to join this great Literacy program.
