
our neighbors, our co-workers, our family, and those we encounter throughout our day?



Don't Forget: YOU can "BE OF GOOD CHEER" to a family in need this month!





## Olso Summer GRSP Scholarship Opens for Georgia College Students with <u>Jan. 10 Deadline</u> to Apply

While Georgia Rotary Student Program spends the year hosting international college students, we are thankful for the one opportunity that allows college students from Georgia to spend the summer attending school and exchanging cultural customs in Norway. The GRSP scholarship application for International Summer School at the University of Oslo for summer 2023 is open.

The Norwegian Rotary Advisory Board partners with GRSP each year to offer the scholarship. The scholarship dates are June 26 to August 4, 2023 and includes students from all over the world in a diverse cultural program in the beautiful city of Oslo, Norway with six weeks of academic achievement and international goodwill. Students must have recommendation of Georgia Rotarian. Application deadline is January 10, 2023 through GRSP website: <a href="www.grsp.org/oslo-application">www.grsp.org/oslo-application</a>. Applications will be reviewed and all applicants will be notified by the end of January.

The opportunity is open to undergraduate and graduate college students who have completed their sophomore year by the end of Spring Semester 2023. Students must be between the ages of 20 to 24, single, in good health and academic standing plus willing to serve as an ambassador for Georgia Rotarians. Scholarship includes air fares from Atlanta to Oslo and return to Atlanta. Scholarship also includes 12-credit hours of undergraduate coursework or one graduate courts, one weekend-excursion, administered by the University of Oslo, room, board and administrative fees for the International Summer School at the University of Oslo. Scholarship recipients must pay their travel expense to and from Atlanta airport, plus provide their own personal spending money. English is the language of instruction. The 77-year program successfully allows students to engage with and learn from students from other countries, building cross-cultural understanding and confidence. Oslo, Norway is a small country in Northern Europe with beautiful and breathtaking scenery, a fascinating history and culture.



## **Mother-Daughter Kunze Duo Share GRSP Experience**







**Thirty-three years ago**, Andrea Reinhold, now Kunze, boarded a plane from Germany to spend a year in **Savannah**, **Georgia** as a scholarship recipient for the **Georgia Rotary Student Program**.

In August of 2022, her daughter Hannah followed her mother's footsteps. The mother-daughter duo are among a handful of family members who have shared the one-year ambassadorial scholarship over the history of the program's 76 years.

Andrea participated in GRSP in 1989 at then Armstrong State College, now Georgia Southern University-Armstrong Campus. She was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Savannah South. Joe Richey, who served as a GRSP Trustee, and his wife Bunnie served as her host family. Hannah is sponsored by the Rotary Club of Habersham County and attends Piedmont University in Demorest in northeast Georgia. Spencer Carr is her GRSP Trustee while Ty and Christina Akins serve as her host family.

Andrea said she heard about Rotary scholarships from a flyer at school. "I wrote to two or three people and it was a coincidence that I discovered GRSP."

The youngest of three children, Andrea was excited to live in the United States for a year. I was curious about getting to know people and a new place," she said. "I collected a few books and magazines about Georgia."

While so much has changed in the world since Andrea's initial trip to Georgia, some things have remained the same. Andrea, her husband Ralph and son Julian joined Hannah this summer before classes started, which gave them a chance to connect with the Richey family and travel the state.

"It was weird because it had been such a long time ago but it also felt like coming home," Andrea said. "It was so good to see the Joe and Bunnie again, as if time stood still.

"I was enthusiastic for Hannah to have the opportunity to study in the US, and I realized how much different it must have been for my parents without the internet and email. My dad and I exchanged letters, and it took about two weeks to arrive. We spoke on the phone, but international calls were expensive and not long."

Three other GRSP students were at Armstrong at the time Andrea attended, including a male from Belgium, along with a female from Denmark and another from France. In 2000, Andrea's host family traveled to Germany to attend her wedding and, ironically, the Richeys shared the same June 24 anniversary.

A few years later, Andrea became a mother, her life got busier, and she lost touch with her GRSP peers and the Richey family.

Fast forward nearly 20 years, and Andrea said her GRSP experience was so positive that she encouraged Hannah to search the internet to investigate her options. Andrea said it was not as difficult to find the information because they knew the name of the program. Andrea reached out to the Richeys by email to inform them that Hannah had applied for the program. They were excited, especially when Hannah was selected for the GRSP scholarship. "Mom always shared stories about the most fun year of her life," Hannah said. At Piedmont, Hannah is enjoying the athletic coaching class and microeconomics. She enjoys the time she spends with her host family and while she enjoys the countryside, she said she is often surprised the travel time and distance between towns in Georgia are more than she imagined.

Hue guided GRSP through 35 years of growth from 1955 to 1989. Georgia Rotary Student Program (GRSP) scholars spent time in Savannah and the surrounding area for the 16<sup>th</sup> Hue Thomas Jr., Weekend sponsored by Savannah-area Rotary Clubs in mid October. Hue, a member of the Rotary Club of Savannah and Past District Governor, guided GRSP through 35 years of growth from 1955 to 1989. Hue and his wife, Alma, enjoyed hosting students from various countries around the world. The weekend named in his memory featured a Low Country Boil along with a ghost tour and visits to the Mighty Eighth Air Force Museum plus the Tybee Island Lighthouse.

GRSP Chair Emeritus Jim Drake, a member of the Rotary Club of Savannah South, served as the weekend chair.

Student weekends allow the class to experience the signature while strengthening their bonds with one another and Rotarians in the Peach State.

The Rotary Club of Savannah, Savannah South Rotary Club, Savannah East Rotary Club, Savannah Sunrise Rotary Club, Richmond Hill Rotary Club, Savannah Metro Rotary Club, The

Rotary Club of West Chatham / Pooler and Skidaway Island Rotary Club sponsored the weekend and served as weekend hosts.

NEXT - The students visited Alpharetta for a student weekend Nov. 11-13, focused on Helping Schools. From fireside chats, to sprucing up a park & school, plus learning how to tailgate (possibly THE most important skill of all) Georgia Rotary Student Program scholars made many memories during their student weekend sponsored by the Rotary Club of Alpharetta. GRSP scholars washed the playground and buses at The Lionheart School for children with autism or other communication needs & helped spread pine straw in nearby Wills Park. Special thanks to weekend chair & GRSP Trustee John Norton along with President Katie Rocco for their excellent hospitality, plus to Rotarian Mickey Rogers for his master barbecue skills and the Rotary Club of Roswell for helping serve as weekend hosts.

Students will spend the holidays apart and gather in February for the GRSP Leadership Weekend.

The GRSP Class of 22-23 features 44 students from 21 different countries attending 23 colleges throughout the state and sponsored by 96 Rotary Clubs throughout Georgia.


