

First Up: The 2022-23 RI President's THEME Means MANY things - - - What will it mean to YOU?

magine Rotary" is the 2022-23 presidential theme that RI President-elect Jennifer Jones revealed on 20 January. She is asking Rotary members to dream big and take action: "We all have dreams, but acting on them is a choice. Imagine a world that deserves our best, where we get up each day knowing that we can make a difference."

The logo for the theme was designed by Riki Salam, an Australian artist and graphic designer specializing in contemporary Indigenous art, design, and communications. He also created the 2023 Rotary International Convention logo which will be held in Melbourne, Australia, thus connecting the two by a shared visual language.

Meaning of the design elements

There is, of course, a deeper meaning behind each element of the design. The circle in aboriginal culture for instance, signifies our connections to one another. The dots around it represent people and there are seven because of Rotary's areas of focus.

The circle and the dots together become a navigation star – our guiding light. The solid line underneath is what is referred to as a digging stick and it is used when doing hard work. And since Rotary members are people of action – it represents a tool for getting things done.

The colors

The colors green, purple, and white are not necessarily connected to aboriginal culture. President-elect Jennifer Jones asked the new crew of Governors to use one, two, or all three when dressing for official events instead of using a theme jacket. "As we celebrate diversity, equity and inclusion, I wanted all of us to be able to express ourselves differently in what we wear, but still have connection," she explained.

There are several ways to interpret the colors: Purple for example stands for polio eradication, green for the environment, the newest addition to our areas of focus, and white for peace, our core mission. Together, they are the colors of the women's movement, the Suffragette – a subtle nod to this history as Jones pointed out, since she will be the first female RI president.

This year - we are conducting a YEAR-LONG CANNED FOOD DRIVE!

The two governors are holding a "friendly competition" to see which service organization can donate the most items. Governor Heather got a head start and collected 350 items during a canned food drive held during District Assembly held at Oconee Fall Line Technical College in Dublin, GA. The Dublin Rotary Club gathered the items and delivered those to Joy Foods for distribution to



those in need in Laurens County.

Human Trafficking Community Event to be Held in Middle Georgia

A QUESTION: To ALL District Rotarians and Clubs -

Are you focusing on the TRAGEDY of Human Trafficking in your community? This is a crisis affecting every town, large and small.

We're Pleased to Announce our District is sponsoring an event focusing on the Crisis and how we can find and create HOPE.

The 2hr Event will take place at Warner Robins THIS MONTH.

The event will be held in an auditorium that holds 350 -- Rotarians and the community are invited.

DG Heather encourages ALL of our District Clubs to send at least one representative to this important event focusing on Human Trafficking in Georgia.

"Let's not, any of us, (especially as Rotarians IMAGINING a better world) bury our heads in the sand.

Instead - let all know ROTARY as a place of HOPE for the lost and captive."

"Exposing the Culture of Human Trafficking" will be an evening of speakers and discussion. This event is open to the community and will be held Thursday July 21st from 6-8pm at the Central Georgia Technical College Auditorium in Warner Robins, GA.

Speakers include Susan Norris, founder and executive director of "Rescuing Hope" and Dr. Tammy Crutchfield, Mercer professor and founder of the student-led education program called "Traffick Jam." Also joining in the discussion is Roswell Rotarian, David McCleary. McCleary founded the Rotary International initiative "End Human Trafficking Now" in 2012 and was recently featured in the July 2022 *Rotary* magazine. Both Norris and McCleary have served on First Lady Marty Kemp's GRACE (Georgians for Refuge, Action, Compassion, and Education) Commission that was created to combat the threat of human trafficking in

the State of Georgia.

Participants will also hear from local state legislators about legislation related to human trafficking currently moving through the legislature.

- -Establish a foundation for peace and service
- -Gain opportunities for active project involvement and support
- -Learn about a region's people, food, languages, customs, and history
- -Find partners for grants"

And I will add, this will be a lot of fun!!!

So, we have sought for partners in an exchange, and we are delighted to announce that we are partnering with Rotary District 4895,

which is based in **Buenos Aires**, **Argentina!** This District has a lot of experience with these exchanges, hosting Districts from other

Latin American, European, and North American countries. And they are very excited about hosting 6920!!!

We will be traveling to Buenos Aires on March 19, or 20, 2023, depending on the best prices for flights...

Delta nonstop leaves Atlanta at 8pm and arrives the next morning in Buenos Aires. We will return on March 30, 2023.

And then, we will host the representatives from Buenos Aires from April 20 to 30, 2023. If you are interested in traveling to Buenos Aires for this exciting adventure, please see the attached brochure and application in this email.

We ask you to fill out the application and return to me as soon as possible. We have set a deadline of September 9, 2022, for

receiving applications, but I encourage you to send these early, if you can... We must, by necessity, limit the group to 10 travelers,

and the spots will go quickly! Each traveler will be responsible for their own airfare (approx. \$1150.00) and incidentals while traveling. Our meals and lodging (in the homes of Rotarians) will mostly be covered by our hosts. Although only a limited number will be able to actually travel for this Exchange, I hope that many of you will support those who travel, and also be willing to help us host the Rotarians from Argentina when they come

next April.






