February Message from Governor Heather;

Greetings, Jim, - and all D6920 Rotarians!!

"What's So Funny About...Peace, Love and Understanding?" Even though nothing seems remotely 'funny' about longing for peace, love and understanding, in this era in which we are living, still, the title of this old Elvis Costello song has been rolling around in my head as I have been contemplating the message this month. The Rotary International focus for February is Peace and Conflict Resolution, and that it's also the month most associated with LOVE...seemed appropriate.

I believe many of us, myself included, think about peace and conflict resolution as something far removed from us. We might believe it's an exercise for world governments or organizations like The United Nations, World Peace Council or Peace Corps. We're concerned, but we feel helpless and believe our small efforts won't make a difference in achieving what seems to be an unattainable goal...WORLD PEACE.

I've always loved the story about the old man walking along the seashore. He finds the tide has gone out and the beach covered with starfish as far as the eye can see. In the distance, he notices a young boy picking up the starfish and throwing them back in the water. As he approaches the young boy he asks him, "What are you doing?' The young boy looks up and replies, "Throwing starfish in the ocean. The tide has washed them up onto the beach and they can't return by themselves. When the sun comes out, they will die unless I help them." The old man responds, "But there are tens of thousands on this beach. I'm afraid you won't really be able to make much of a difference." The boy bends down, picks up another starfish and throws it as far as he can. "It made a difference to that one."

What is our role in peace and conflict resolution? First, we start in our own homes, then move on to our workplace, and then to our communities. Some of us might take on larger roles and make an impact in our country or around the world, but for most of us it's quite simple...just be nice! Start throwing some starfish in the ocean. Let's be considerate of

other's opinions and ideas. We may not agree with one another. We may not like what someone is wearing or how they're acting. We may disagree with who they love, or who they follow as their leader. We don't have to agree on those things to resolve conflict and create peace. Let's strive to live with our differences and find common things to believe in... health, family, love, peace. Do your part in building peace!



With over forty clubs participating in the District Grants Program we have already seen four grants completed and paid!

However, we still have another thirty-six Approved District Grants in progress, as a reminder, when you finish your clubs grant, complete your final report and get reimbursed. There is still over 46,000 dollars yet to be reimbursed.

Our deadline for Final report completion is 15 May, 2023.

Important Bullet Points:

REPORT to GET PAID

Grant awards will be paid on a reimbursement basis. As soon as the project is finished, clubs may submit the Final Report for Reimbursement.

Your Budget should be balanced.

List expenses separately.

Complete the Documents tab by uploading itemized Receipts/Invoices of what was purchased and cancelled checks or copies of bank statements proving expenditure of funds.

Upload pictures under Images.

Complete the Final Report tab then click Submit to District for Approval Final Report Instructions

Club Completes District Grant Project

Club president Jessica Suggs has made it her mission to make sure that children never have to miss a meal.

Her passion and encouragement prompted the Millen Club to create a District Grant Project they are calling their "Pancake Christmas."

The club presented *every student* at Jenkins County Middle School, <u>all 300 students</u>, a Christmas gift that included a box of pancake mix, a bottle of syrup, a whisk and a card from our club "whisking" them a Merry Christmas.

Once the news of the project became known to the community, others wanted to be involved.

Local teens helped the club raise \$185.00 with a Dunking Booth fundraiser.

The local flower shop donated ribbon and the grocery store donated all 300 bottles of syrup. The nearby prison also donated \$200 to help cover some costs.

And then, of course, Rotarians came together to assemble all 300 bags and distribute them - individually - to the students in the classrooms.


